
Simple Gradebook





Grade Pie








Assignments are categorized

Weights are assigned to each category


You control the pie up front




Weighted Categories & Weighted Assignments

 Categories are weighted as before, and each assignment is given a weight within the category.



Two 100-point assignments, same weight




Two 100-point assignments, weights 1 & 2



Weighted Categories & Assignments

- Each used category is assigned a weight
- Assignment's Maximum score and weight are DIFFERENT
- Assignment weight is relative to the other assignments in the category only

Weighted Categories & Assignments

- If you weight categories and assignments, the actual point values for assignments become irrelevant
 - If two assignments both have the same weight within a category, one could be scored out of 37 points and one could be scored out of 68, and they would count equally!
