- 2. Is there a process to **copy a course from year to year** (or term to term)?


 Yes Class Migrations allow copying all class content from one class to another. We will review this process together at a later faculty meeting. The content that is copied includes:

I've pasted the teacher, parent, and student view of the same feedback.






