


WRITERS' WORKSHOP SERIES 2013



REBECCA MAKKAI THURSDAY, OCTOBER 3

Rebecca Makkai's first novel, *The Borrower*, was a Booklist Top Ten Debut, an Indie Next pick, an *O Magazine* selection, and one of *Chicago Magazine*'s choices for best fiction of 2011. Her short fiction was chosen for *The Best American Short Stories* in 2011, 2010, 2009, and 2008, and has been featured

in several college literature textbooks. Her new stories appear regularly in publications such as *Harper's*, *Tin House*, *Ploughshares*, and on public radio's *This American Life*. Her second novel, *The Hundred-Year House*, will be available in 2014 from Viking/Penguin. Ms. Makkai teaches at Lake Forest College, StoryStudio Chicago, and Sierra Nevada College.



PATRICIA MCCORMICK MONDAY, OCTOBER 7

Patricia McCormick, author of Never Fall Down, has written four other critically acclaimed novels: Sold, a moving account of sexual trafficking, a National Book Award finalist; Purple Heart, a suspenseful psychological novel that explores the killing of a 10-year-old boy in Iraq; My Brother's Keeper, a realistic view of teenage substance abuse,

and *Cut*, an intimate portrait of one girl's struggle with self-injury. McCormick was named a New York Foundation on the Arts fellow in 2004. She is also the winner of the 2009 German Peace Prize for Youth Literature. She is a graduate of the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism and lives Manhattan.
